Montenegro's property market will be boosted by the news that Montenegro Airlines will introduce direct flights from London Stansted to Tivat in Montenegro, starting from 4 May 2008.

This is positive news for anyone buying property in Montenegro, as previously there have only been direct flights to Dubrovnik airport, Croatia, from where visitors then had to travel down to Montenegro.

Justin Faiz, managing director of Pluto Developments told Homes Overseas Online: "The introduction of direct flights from London to Tivat is the news that Montenegro property buyers have been waiting for. Apart from increasing the ease by which property owners can visit, the new flight routes are expected to boost the popularity of Montenegro as a tourist destination. Previously, the most common way to travel was via Dubrovnik in Croatia and in anticipation of this news, we located our newest apartment project Acacia Hill Apartments at Djenovici, only 15km from the airport.

Pluto Developments is currently offering 36 two, three and four-bedroom apartments at Acacia Hill Apartments, in Djenovici, Montenegro, with prices range from €130,000 to €215,000.

Faiz adds: "Djenovici is Montenegro at its most picturesque and unspoilt. Further to the planned new flights, we chose the area because of its natural beauty, easy access to the rest of the coast and because the government is keen to preserve the area's character for future generations. Its stance means there will be a restriction in the supply of new properties, which along with its status as the fastest growing tourist destination in the world, should contribute to a predicted doubling of Montenegrin property prices within the next four years."
